- i. Instead of 2 elective courses 3 elective courses were given in this structure.
- ii. Instead of 2 core courses in the III and IV semesters 1 core course and 1 elective course were offered.
- iii. Project is given in the V Semester and 1 elective in the VI semester.

- ii. The core course "Indian Writing in English" was changed into "Poetry"
- iii. The NMEC "English for Competitive Examinations" was changed into "English for Life."
- iv. The allied course of the II semester (2017-20 syllabus) "Modern English Grammar and Composition" was taken as the core paper for the II semester with the addition of a chapter on "Punctuation and Capitals".
- v. The allied course of the III semester "Literary Forms and Terms" (2017-20 syllabus) was shifted to the II semester.
- vi. The NMEC "English for Communication" was changed into "English for Career."

Changes to be made as per the Recommendations and Suggestions by the Subject Experts:

- i. In Major Core I: "Poetry", one poem has to be removed from Unit I to Unit IV. In Unit I Edmund Spenser's "One Day I Wrote her Name upon the Strand", in Unit II Ted Hughes's "Thought Fox", in Unit III Sarojini Naidu's "In the Bazaar's of Hyderabad" and in Unit IV Peter Porter's "Your Attention Please" were suggested to be removed.
- ii. Web sources and Compiled text books should be included for the appropriate courses.
- iii. In Allied "Social History of England" topics like "World War/ Impact of World War", "Colonial Expansion" and topics relevant to twentieth Century could be added and the topics "The Methodist Movement" and "Other Humanitarian Movements" have to be replaced.

- iv. For the NMEC course "English for Life", CO-3 has to be modified and CO-5 can be deleted and in Unit II "Idioms and Proverbs" has to be changed into "Idioms and Phrases", in Unit III "Sequence of Sentences" has to be replaced with "Jumbled Words" and in Unit IV "Descriptive Essays" has to be replaced with "Letter Writing".
- v. In Core II: "Modern English Grammar and Composition", CO-4 has to be modified.
- vi. In Allied II: "Literary Forms and Terms" Unit I to Unit IV could be taken for Forms and Unit V for Terms. Sub genres of novel could be added. In Reference Books, M.H. Abrams' work has to be included.
- vii. For NMEC course "English for Career" has to be modified.

ii. The core courses "Chaucer to Milton", "World Literature", "and Dryden to Fielding" and

[&]quot;Introduction to Literary Theories" were introduced.

iii. The core courses "Indian Writing in English", "American Literature" and "World Literature in Translation" were modified.

iv. The elective I "Five Approaches to Literary Criticism" was modified and renamed as "Critical Approaches to Literature".

- Irving Babbit's "Genius and Taste", Kenneth Burke's "The Poetic Process", Joseph Wood Krutch's "The Tragic Fallacy", Elderly Olson's "Sailing to Byzantium" and Gilbert Murray's "Hamlet and Orestes" were removed from "Five Approaches to Literary Criticism".
- v. The Elective I (b) Psychology in Literature was shifted from IV semester to II semester with a little modification.
 - In Unit IV Toni Morrison's Sula and Anita Nair's Mistress were replaced with Alex Michaelides's The Silent Patient.
- vi. The core course "World Classics in Translation" was renamed as "World Literature in Translation" and Milan Kundera's *Book of Laughter Forgetting* of Unit IV was replaced with Han Kang's *The Vegetarian*.
- vii. In the elective II (a) Feminist Writings, the following changes were made:

 In Unit I Elaine Showalter's "Feminist Criticism in Wilderness" was replaced with Mary

 Wollstonecraft's "A Vindication of the Rights of Woman" (Chapter-II).

 In Unit II Poetry Anne Sexton's "Housewife" and Sylvia Plath's "Mirror" were added.

 In Unit V Drama, Mahasweta Devi's Bayen was replaced with Alice Gerstenberg's

 Overtones.
- viii. A new elective course "Human Rights and Literature" was introduced.

Changes to be made as per the Recommendations and Suggestions by the Subject Experts:

- i. All the courses should be uniform in giving novel and drama for self study.
- ii. In Core I "Chaucer to Milton" Francis Bacon's "Of Goodness and Goodness of Nature" from Unit II can be changed and in Unit V one more drama can be included.
- iii. In Core II "Indian Writing in English" from Unit I Jawaharlal Nehru's "The Panorama of India's Past" and from Unit II Shanta Acharya's "Highgate Cemetry" can be removed. In Unit IV R.K. Narayan's novel can be replaced with Mulkraj Anand's *Untouchable*.
- iv. In Core III: "American Literature" Unit II has to be modified and O'Neill's Long Day's Journey into Night can be added in Unit V.
- v. Core IV "World Literature" can be removed and Canadian Literature of 2017-2020 syllabus has to be retained.
- vi. Texts have to be included for self study in Elective I (a) Critical Approaches to Literature. vii. Elective I (b) Psychology in Literature and Elective I (c) Disability Theory and Literature can be modified

viii. In Core V: "Dryden to Johnson", Unit IV - John Dryden's All for Love can be replaced with any other drama of the same period

ix. In Core VII: "Research Methodology" Unit I from MLA Handbook – 7th Edition can be included.

x. In Core VIII: "Introduction to Literary Theories" Michel Foucault's "What is an Author?" from Unit II and Gilbert and Gubar's from the *Madwoman in the Attic* from Unit IV can be replaced. Also page numbers can be included for self study.

xi. In Elective II (b): "Postcolonial Literature" for Unit II – Poetry more poems can be included and for Unit V - Drama Mahesh Dattani's play can be replaced with Girish Karnad's play *Hayavadana*.
