The rest of the syllabus for I& II semesters will be kept intact as per TANSCHE.

One credit of theory paper is 15 hours and one paper of practical course is 30 hours.

The departmental open elective will be Hospital Administration during the odd semester (I Sem) and NGO Management for the even semester. These will be value added courses open for the other departments.

In the I semester the course on Community Organisation and Social Action in Unit V, In the place of Anna Hazare&AamAdmi Movement, Environmental Movements and Women's Movement can be added

In SEC I, for Alternative media course, External experts can be asked to prepare the content in consultation with BoS. Alternatively, instead of 'Alternative media' course, 'Proposal Writing' course could be considered.

Workshops on perspective building could be organized for Social Work students by bringing in local activists.
