#### STUDENT INDUCTION PROGRAMME


Student Induction Programme was organized by Internal Quality Assurance Cell of our College from 19-08-2020 to 21-08-2020 for the first year UG students. The induction programme was brought in with a view to uplift the level of the entrants to an elevated stage, promote all-round development and exposing learners' stigmas to minimize and to maximize their learning. As the learners come with diverse thoughts, backgrounds and perceptions, it becomes important to help them adjust and feel comfortable to the new environment, inculcate the ethos of the institution, help them build bonds with other students and faculty members, expose them to a sense of larger purpose and self-exploration. The sessions were designed to improve students' awareness and motivate them for the branch they have chosen. All the sessions motivated students to start thinking towards the path they need to adopt for the coming years to achieve their goals.

To mark the beginning of the academic year and Induction Programme, on 19-08-2020, the programme began with invoking presence of god through a prayer by Dr.Benit, Assistant Professor of Botany and it was followed by the College Anthem. Dr.Sr.Leema Rose, Vice Principal of our college welcomed the parents and the students. Dr.M.Anitha Malbi, Assistant Professor of Chemistry and Coordinator of Parents Teachers Association read the report. - Polycystic ovarian syndrome (PCOS) is a common endocrine disorder affecting female adolescent and adulthood globally. The most annoying complications of PCOS are obesity and infertility.
- The clinical features comprise of reproductive manifestations such as reduced frequency of ovulation, menstrual irregularity, reduced fertility, abdominal obesity, sonographic evidence of ovarian cysts, and high levels of male hormones such as testosterone and androstenedione.
- Vigorito et al (2007) found that women diagnosed with PCOS who were not ovulating, were able to restore their normal menstrual cycle following a 3-month aerobic training program

Jarith enlightened the audience by emphasizing the importance of writing skills and provided various activities to enhance creative thinking among the participants. The session aimed to underscore the significance of these skills.

In total, 244 students benefited from the program. Ms. Elza Therese Levin, Assistant Professor of English (SF), delivered the vote of thanks. The lecture concluded at 3:15 p.m.



### REMEDIAL COACHING

Holy Cross College (Autonomous), Nagercoil initiated remedial coaching for the academic year 2021-2022 on August 24, 2020. This program was designed to support both slow learners and advanced learners. Slow learners were provided with easy-to-understand notes, mind map, flow chart, MCQ, peer teaching, modules, worksheets, open book tests, slip tests, and other supportive materials to aid their learning process. Advanced learners engaged in a variety of activities, including teaching spoken English classes to students from other departments, paper presentation, book review, SLP, master of ceremony, peer review, coaching slow learners, participating in a readers club, engaging in debates, and developing entrepreneurial skills.
